# A BILL

- To require the Secretary of the Army to convey or lease certain land acquired for the Table Rock Lake project to owners of property located adjacent to such project, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Table Rock Lake Prop-
  - 5 erty Flexibility Act".

#### 1 SEC. 2. TABLE ROCK LAKE LEASE AGREEMENTS.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Upon the request of an owner of
3 covered property, the Secretary shall—

- 4 (1) convey to such owner all right, title, and in5 terest of the United States in and to covered land;
  6 or
- 7 (2) enter into a lease agreement with such8 owner for covered land.

9 (b) CONSIDERATION.—Any owner to which a convey-10 ance is made under this section or who enters into a lease 11 agreement under this section shall pay to the Secretary 12 an amount that is not more than 150 percent of the fair 13 market value of the covered land.

(c) CONVEYANCE CONDITIONS.—The Secretary may
not require, as a condition of conveying covered land under
this section, an owner to remove any structures existing
on such land.

(d) LEASE CONDITIONS.—With respect to any covered land that is subject to a lease entered into under this
section, the Secretary may not—

(1) require the removal of any structures existing on such land before the date on which the lease
is entered into; or

24 (2) prohibit or limit the installation of any25 structures on such land after such date.

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(e) LEASE FUNDS.—Any amounts generated from a
 lease agreement entered into under this section shall be
 used by the Secretary for infrastructure for recreational
 activities related to the Lake and maintenance of such in frastructure.

6 (f) LIABILITY.—

7 (1) CONVEYANCE.—An owner to which a con-8 veyance is made under this section shall hold the 9 United States harmless from any liability with re-10 spect to activities carried out, on or after the date 11 of the conveyance, on the land conveyed. The United 12 States shall remain responsible for any liability with respect to activities carried out, before such date, on 13 14 the land conveyed.

15 (2) LEASE.—The United States shall not be lia16 ble or responsible for damage to any structure that
17 is installed on covered land that is subject to a lease
18 entered into under this section.

#### 19 SEC. 3. ALTERATIONS TO DOCKS ON TABLE ROCK LAKE.

The Secretary may not prohibit any individual with a lease or easement for a dock located on the Lake from making alterations to such dock, or to the land adjacent to such dock, that make such dock accessible to individuals with disabilities. 4

### 1 SEC. 4. DEFINITIONS.

2 In this Act:

- 3 (1) COVERED LAND.—
- 4 (A) IN GENERAL.—The term "covered 5 land" means the portion of fee land that is 6 within a 100-foot radius of any covered prop-7 erty and that is directly linear to such covered 8 property.
- 9 (B) EXCLUSION.—The term "covered
  10 land" does not include land that is located with11 in the flood plain of the Lake.
- (2) COVERED PROPERTY.—The term "covered
  property" means any property located directly adjacent to fee land.
- 15 (3) FEE LAND.—The term "fee land" means
  16 the land acquired in fee title by the United States
  17 for the Lake.
- (4) LAKE.—The term "Lake" means the Table
  Rock Lake project of the Corps of Engineers, located in Missouri and Arkansas, authorized as one
  of the multiple-purpose reservoir projects in the
  White River Basin by section 4 of the Act of June
  28, 1938 (52 Stat. 1218).
- 24 (5) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means
  25 the Secretary of the Army, acting through the Chief
  26 of Engineers.
